
St James' Graveyard, Benwell

Introduction to the Environmental Learning Resource Pack

This pack contains a set of information and activity sheets designed to be used in conjunction with site visits to St James' Graveyard.

Nature in St James' Graveyard

Information: an illustrated introduction to the range of plants, animals and other wildlife to be found here.

Activity: a "Wildlife Spotter" activity sheet and "Wildlife Quiz" are provided to accompany this leaflet.

Trees in St James' Graveyard

Information: a photographic guide to 12 species of trees growing here.

Activity: this leaflet is designed to be used as the basis for an activity in which children explore the graveyard and identify different types of trees.

Insects in St James' Graveyard

Information: a picture guide to the range of insects living here.

Activity: this leaflet is a useful accompaniment to a mini-beast hunt.

Lichen in St James' Graveyard

Information: a photographic guide to some of the types of lichen and fungi here.

Activity: this leaflet encourages children to look more closely and carefully at some of the lesser known inhabitants of our environment.
